# 4. OFFICERS' REPORTS

### Chairman

Twenty-five ringers attended the Sandra Winter Skills Day, which went ahead as planned. The two pieces of music practised during the day were Sandra's arrangement of *Twinkle Rocks* and *The Jubellee Celebration Polka* which allowed ringers to practise familiar and some less familiar ringing techniques. Everyone agreed that it had been a most worthwhile and enjoyable day, including the non-member ringers who attended. (*One ringer has joined the WMBE and has registered as an HRGB member*.)

At the end of August, residents in Eastcote care home (near Solihull) were entertained by three ex-members of the Wood Green High School four-in-hand team (Richard, Debbie and Chris)

During June, at very short notice, some ringers had an interesting afternoon at a Girl Guide's meeting in Worcester. The Guides participated and enjoyed their handbell ringing "taster session". The Guiding officers were very interested and keen to pursue this activity.

#### Treasurer

There has been very little activity since the last meeting.

The Treasurer gave an analysis of the expenses for the Sandra Winter Skills Day, which proved very successful, resulting in a profit of £ 234.07 (including the

£100 donation). The Chairman agreed with the Treasurer's suggestion that since the day made a profit, the anonymous donor be offered a refund. The donor was happy that 50% of the donation remained in the region's funds, resulting in an overall profit of £184.07. The balance in the current account to date stands at £1926.25, which includes one payment for the Regional Rally and four deposits for the 2026 BBB event.

### Secretary

- Two regional Newsletters have been circulated to committee members (SE and NW)
- Responses have been received from seven teams and three Independent Members, to the invitation to the Regional Rally.
- Regrettably, due to health problems, Jane Smith is having to stand down as one of the guest conductors at the Regional Rally.
- A request has been received from a lady for ringers to play at her wedding on June 9<sup>th</sup> 2027, at Dewsall Court Church, Hereford.
- Details of Knighton HR were sent to Morwenna Peppin, who requested details of teams in the Knighton/Leominster area for her daughter.
- Information about the WMBE has been sent to Elise Li, who has immigrated to this country from Hong Kong. She was a music conductor and a member of a Hong Kong team since 2003, before moving to this country.
